



NEWS: THE GAMEBIRD FOUNDATION

What a last couple of months we have had. We have brought in around 9,000 baby pheasant chicks, give or take a couple hundred. All these baby chicks will be raised until they are 10-12 weeks old and then released as wild birds into the best habitat that we can find. I do know that we have gone through 300 bags of baby chick pheasant starter feed, at a cost to the Foundation of about \$22.00 a bag for the medicated feed. NEW Exciting News! We acquired 300 Red Leg Partridge eggs this spring and had them hatched at Little Canyon Shooting Preserve in Peck, ID. This is new for Northern Idaho and for us! These birds habitat well in both farmland and forest. We hope they do well here on the Palouse and the Camas Prairie. We have done a lot of research on them and they do very well in the upper Midwestern states. We have some pictures of the babies on the Facebook page just in the brooder. We want to thank everyone that donated funding to purchase the eggs and the feed to raise them, and the wonderful Foundation members that are raising them. We will raise these birds until they are 12 to 16 weeks old before we release them into habitat.

Remember, the Gamebird Foundation meets the first Tuesday at the Latah County Fairgrounds. Board meeting starts at 6:00 p.m., public meeting starts at 6:30 p.m. The public is invited to take part at 6:30 p.m. after the board meeting. Please wear a mask and practice safe social distancing. Take care and be safe!

How to Help Our Idaho Schools

Idaho ranks last among the 50 states and the District of Columbia in K-12 per-student funding. And now, Governor Little has recommended a 5% budget cut to K-12 funding (~\$99 million) due to COVID-19. However, there is a way for us to generate needed funding for education in our state:

The grassroots organization **Reclaim Idaho** had been collecting signatures in person on their **Invest in Idaho** until that effort was stopped due to COVID-19. However, they are now collecting signatures electronically. If enough signatures are collected by the August 25 deadline, the initiative will be on the November 3 ballot when we will have the opportunity to vote on it.

Invest in Idaho would raise about \$170-200 million every year for a Quality Education Fund to be used to address critical needs in our schools. Funds would be used to:

- Attract and retain highly qualified teachers
- Pay for classroom materials
- Invest in Career Technical Education
- Invest in full-day Kindergarten
- Provide special education services, and more...

Funds would come from a modest increase of a 3% tax only on the amount of income OVER \$250,000 for an individual or OVER \$500,000 for a couple. The corporate tax rate would be set back to what it was in 2000, a modest 1% increase, 95% of Idahoans would see no change in their taxes.



OUR SCHOOLS—June/July 2020

It is hard to believe that we are just one month away from the start of a new school year! As most of you are aware, the COVID-19 pandemic has sent our world, our nation, and our state into complete turmoil. The school district is working extremely hard and diligently in developing “back-to-school” protocols for our students and staff, in order to open our doors to a safe, comfortable learning environment. Earlier in the month of July, the district sent out a seven (7) question survey to parents of students within our district. Thank you to all of our parents that responded back! In all, we had 251 completed surveys. The results of the survey were as follows:

- ◆ School is scheduled to resume on Monday, August 24. Would you like for that date to remain the opening date or would you like to see the date pushed back further until more information is known about what the state of Idaho is recommending or mandating due to the COVID-19 outbreak? **65% Yes - Keep the Same 35% No – Wait**
- ◆ Did you have good Internet/wireless connectivity services this past Spring when we went into our “soft” closure? **67% Yes 33% No**
- ◆ When asked to rank school options from the best choice to the least favorite choice, our survey responses were:
 - ◆ **64% Ranked “traditional” opening and look to school the best choice.**
 - ◆ **33% Ranked an “A/B Schedule” – No on-line classes – as their second choice.**
 - ◆ **34% Ranked a “hybrid A/B Schedule” – Traditional classroom & on-line classes combined together – as the third choice.**
 - ◆ **65% Ranked “Virtual Distance Learning and all on-line classes” – as their least favorite option.**
- ◆ Other than a traditional schedule, would going to any of these other options cause concerns/problems with day care services for you? **27% Yes 73% No**
- ◆ Would you send your child or children to school if there are requirements for health and safety conditions put in place (these may include masks for students and staff, taking temperatures for students and staff (and guests) as they enter school, etc.)? **29% OK with Recommended 25% OK with Mandated 46% OK with Both**

These results will be used to help drive our decision-making when it comes to what our school district will look like when we reopen in the Fall. The district has been having weekly meetings, attended by parent representatives, teachers, staff, and administrators, in order to answer many of the difficult questions about our school reentry, as well as develop protocols that will assist in the safety of our students, staff, and schools from Day 1 of the new school year. A decision on our school reentry plan will be proposed and shared to the Board and decided upon (tentatively) by **August 1st**.

Although most of our time during the past few months has been focused on the reentry of students and staff back into our schools, there are still tasks that need to take place that happen every summer, such as the recruitment, selection, and hiring of new staff. I want to congratulate the two newest members to the Potlatch School District staff. They are:

- ◆ Alex Lardie - K-12 Music Teacher
- ◆ Rachel Usasz-Keber - Jr. High English/High School Speech

We are excited for them to be with us and we are hoping that they are part of our educational “family” for many years to come!
