What is the Potlatch Recreation District?

The Potlatch Recreation District was created in 2001 through efforts of local community members and appointment by the governor. Idaho Recreation Districts are organized for the uses and purposes of acquiring, providing, maintaining, and operating public recreation areas and facilities for the use of the public. Potlatch Recreation District serves the Harvard, Princeton, and Potlatch areas. The district is administered by 3 publicly elected directors residing in 3 sub districts and is funded through tax dollars.

Many of our projects are quite visible in our communities. The park in Princeton was purchased, built and is maintained by the Rec. District. The Scenic Six Park lighting, swimming pool repairs, horseshoe pits, flags, and baseball/softball fields and their lawn care are provided by the Recreation District. Our projects last year included the new backstops at the upper field at the elementary school, a portion of funding for the PTO's new playground equipment on both sides of the elementary school, a supply shed for the Onaway Park, youth baseball funding, pickleball court, bleachers and the Potlatch pool. As we need to maintain our projects, this year we would like to save for improvements to the Scenic Six ball fields

Grants for project funding can be applied for by anyone! We encourage recommendations for projects, which will be taken into consideration at monthly public meetings.

If she doesn't answer the phone, please leave a message or send her an email and I will get back to you as soon as I can. I look forward to another productive year of raising Pheasants and Red Legged Partridges with the Game Bird Foundation.

OUR SCHOOLS: February/March 2021

There is a lot to share this past month, as well as for the start of March. The biggest news is that we will be moving from our current model of school, which is/was a "Hybrid – A/B" model, where our students were attending school two (2) days a week and working from home the remaining three (3) with online supports from their teachers. This will all change on Monday, February 22. We will be returning to a more traditional model and our students will return to school full-time, five (5) days a week, and all-day, every day. This will be in place for the remainder of the school year unless a reoccurrence of the pandemic comes back or something of that nature would force us to change back to a hybrid model or virtual model of educational delivery. Here's hoping and fingers crossed!

It's Levy time again. We will be running our annual Supplemental Levy on Tuesday, March 9. For the past three (3) years we have been steady, running the levy for \$1,750,000 each of those years. This year, the levy has been lowered by \$100,000. It will now be run for \$1,650.000. This will provide a savings to our taxpayers, and in a time where we all have been hit hard due to the pandemic, every amount of relief and savings is needed and appreciated.

We will be sending flyers out to all taxpayers and homeowners in the next few weeks, sharing exact information on district needs, tax rates, and estimated changes and costs. We will also be providing a "town hall" meeting for all interested stakeholders. Supplemental levy information will be shared by the Board of Trustees at that time and discussion time will be given for the community to ask questions. This will be held on Tuesday, March 2, at 7:00 p.m., and will be held at the Jr.-Sr. High School Gymnasium. We will be spread out throughout the Gym in order to maintain social distancing whenever possible. Masks and/or face shields will be required to be worn inside our facility. If you would like to listen to the discussion, we will also be placing the meeting on Zoom, so those who cannot attend will still have the opportunity to listen in.

Two staff members have turned in their resignations and will be leaving us shortly. Lisa Bunney, almost ten (10) years as our Elementary Custodian, will be leaving us at the end of February for a new job opportunity. Lisa has been an outstanding worker and a valuable member of the Elementary staff. She will be tremendously missed. We wish her the very best in all her future endeavors. The retirement "bells" are starting to ring for Mr. John Haire, our Elementary School Principal. John has worked for our District for thirty (30) years! The first nineteen (19) of which were as an elementary teacher and the last eleven (11) years have been spent as the Elementary Principal. John will finish out the remainder of this school year and then bid us all "adieu" this coming June after a great and outstanding career as an educator and leader. He too will be sorely missed.

Potlatch Alumni Scholarship

In 1985, a fund was established to annually offer a scholarship to a graduate of Potlatch High School. Each year up to 30 Potlatch High graduates apply for this scholarship. There are four (4) criteria for eligibility for the scholarship:

- 1. Be a graduate of Potlatch High School
- 2. Have demonstrated scholastic or vocational ability
- 3. Have financial need
- 4. Have demonstrated potential to succeed

Applications are available each year from Potlatch High School. Only those making applications for the scholarship on forms to be provided shall be eligible, including prior recipients. Applications are available on the Potlatch School District website under the College and Career Center. Completed applications shall be turned into the principal or counselor by May 15.

We encourage alumni to contribute to the fund. All contributions apply only to the principal. The interest gained from donations is awarded annually as a scholarship; therefore, all donations will continue to provide scholarship money forever. An annual report is compiled each year to show additions to the fund, income gained and available, the funds awards, and a progress report on the recipients.
