


February is National Pet Dental Health Month!

Gamebird Foundation February 2021 News:

2020 was a busy year for the Gamebird Foundation, since I took over the supplies for the birds, feed, picking up birds, and distributing all of the above. I foresee 2021 to be just as busy, if not more so, since our goal is to raise more birds. I love doing all of this since I had a poultry business in Kodiak, AK, before I moved to Idaho and have raised birds for the last 16 years. I love sharing what I have learned in raising domesticated and wild birds. I also love hearing the success stories of raising pheasants and Red-Legs from the other Foundation members and have shared what works with others.

You, too, can raise pheasants for release in our Region by becoming a Member or renewing your Membership with the Gamebird Foundation. It is just \$25 for a 1-year membership for a family. Go online to our website and join/renew now: www.thegamebirdfoundation.org/.

Pheasants will be available to be raised from May 1st to June 30th. These dates may vary depending on how the hatching goes. I will keep everyone informed. There will be approximately 800-1200 birds available for distribution each week. You will need to contact me ASAP to let me know which week you want to receive Pheasant chicks and how many you would like to raise at one time. Please send me an email with all of your contact information, the number of chicks to raise, and your 1st, 2nd and 3rd choice weeks to receive them. I will accommodate your requested dates and amounts the best I can. Red-Legged Partridge dates will be determined once the eggs go in the incubator. It will most likely be after the last hatch date for the pheasants.

Please contact me with your questions about raising Pheasants, to pick up brooders, soft release/flight pens, and any other supplies needed to raise the pheasants. If I don't answer the phone, please leave a message or send me an email and I will get back to you as soon as I can. I look forward to another productive year of raising Pheasants and Red-Legged Partridges with the Game Bird Foundation.

OUR SCHOOLS: JANUARY/FEBRUARY 2021

We are off and running into the new year and working hard to get our students back to school into a more traditional model of four or five days a week and in school altogether with their peers. Our re-entry plan was developed by our Board of Trustees, our Administration, and our teaching staff, and is based on current trends in our region, both county and local, on COVID-related cases and a level system for operating conditions for our schools to be in for us to return to school on a more full-time basis. For the most part, these conditions and guidelines were developed by the North Central Health District & the CDC. As a school district, we "tweaked" them to fit our needs. Licensed & Insured in Idaho & Washington With the return to a more traditional model of delivery, the district will be losing one of the strengths that came from our "Hybrid" model of delivery, that being the ability to social distance properly. In losing this opportunity, the school district will be requiring students and staff to wear masks and/or face shields <u>inside</u> of our buildings. This will not be an option or a recommendation, this will be a <u>requirement</u>. Also, with the introduction and rollout of the COVID-19 vaccine within our state and nation, our staff have the opportunity to receive further protection, if they so choose, by receiving vaccination shots. Currently, we have nearly 60% of our staff interested in being vaccinated. Once the vaccination process has been completed and local/county COVID-19 levels are meeting re-entry plan requirements, school will move from the "Hybrid, A-B" delivery model to an "All-day, Every day" model. We are cautious and making sure that we do everything possible to keep students and staff safe and healthy. At the same time, we are extremely excited to take this step forward to provide the opportunity for students to receive a more complete education, to be able to socialize and play with their peers, and most importantly, be full-time students again.

The Board of Trustees and Administration set our Supplemental Levy amount for the upcoming school year of 2021-2022. For the past three (3) years we have stayed steady at \$1,750,000, no increases over that time. I am pleased to say that this year we will be able to lower the levy amount, from \$1,750,000 to \$1,650,000. This is a significant decrease and will allow some tax relief to our taxpayers at a time where every little bit of financial savings can help. The Levy vote will take place on Tuesday, March 9th. I will provide more information and details on our Supplemental Levy in next month's CIA, as well as on our District's website so stay tuned.


